

# The Problem

Substantial number of Grade 1 to 3 learners are struggling with basic reading skills.





# **The Context**

24 learners from Grades 1 to 3 fall under letter level, a result taken from the Functional Literacy Assessment Tool (FLAT) given by the school. A learner is marked at a letter level if he/she can read 4 out of 5 letters with ease but cannot comfortably read words.



### **Stakeholders Pain Points**

#### LEARNER

- > Feeling frustrated and discouraged due to their academic difficulties.
- Falling behind their peers, leading to low selfesteem and confidence.

### TEACHER

Facing challenges in addressing diverse learning needs within the classroom

### **PARENTS**

Limited understanding of how to support their children's learning at home.

#### **BARANGAY OFFICIAL**

> Pressure to improve educational outcomes without sufficient funding or infrastructure.





Only 3.6% of Grades 1-3 pupils in Dona Aurora H. Bueno are able to understand simple English texts.

This didn't change much since 2021. They will likely go to higher grade level with poor reading skills.
