Explain your innovation briefly

- Fort del Pilar National High School has been identified as a recipient of a memorandum titled "Downloading of the Alternative Delivery Modes Program Support Fund to Recipient Schools With High Drop Out Rates." The school is expected to create a project proposal aligned with ADM to decrease the dropout rate.
- □ The creation of the project SAVE DREAMS aims to reduce the school's current dropout rate and improve students' academic performance.

Problem Statement - What problem does the innovation seek to address

□ In the past three years (School Years 2020-2021, 2021-2022, and 2022-2023), the school had a 0% dropout rate due to implementing the Alternative Delivery Mode. However, the rate increased to 1% in the 2023-2024 school year during the second implementation of face-to-face learning, with 9 students choosing not to continue their studies despite interventions by teachers.

How does the project demonstrate a clear understanding of the needs of your school community?

The program encompasses a range of activities, including home visitation and parent-teacher and learner conferences to establish strong connections, tutorials to provide additional support, the implementation of Strengthening Alternative Delivery Mode, and the organization of Psychosocial Activities to address the holistic needs of the students. Project 'SAVE DREAMS' is an initiative designed to address the issue of school dropouts by actively involving families, communities, and various stakeholders in fostering an environment conducive to the development of lifelong learners



The Problem

- The dropout rate increased to 1% in the school year 2023-2024 during the second implementation of face-to-face learning, with 9 students choosing not to continue their studies despite interventions by teachers.
- □ FDPNHS' last 5 school years, the average percentage of parents' and guardians' attendance during the conduct of school assemblies from the school year 2017-2018 to 2021-2022 is 59%.
- Research results conducted for SY 2023-2024 showed that parental participation in school-initiated activities at FDPNHS varied based on several factors: age, Marital status, Educational attainment, Socio-economic status, and Number of children.



The Context

Fort del Pilar National High School serves 7 catchment areas: Fort del Pilar, Kias, Atok Trail, Apugan Loakan, Loakan Magsaysay, Ampucao, and Virac. The school deals with students who have diverse personalities, learning styles, and needs.
